This Event Advisers' Clinic is organised for the education and recruitment of new IOF licensed Mountain Bike Orienteering Event Advisers and organizers. National orienteering federations are asked to identify and enter suitable candidates.

Clinic site: Orienteering Clubhouse, Birkerød

Course Objectives and requirements: The main objective of this IOF Event Advisers' and Organisers' Clinic is to prepare participants to be licensed IOF MTB orienteering Event Advisers and familiarise experienced foot orienteering organisers with the specifics of MTB orienteering.

The requirements for licensing are:

1. Be an active MTB orienteer.
2. Have competed in countries other than your own.
3. Have controlled or played a major part in the organisation of national or international standard MTBO events in the last 3 years.
4. Be competent to communicate with IOF and the organising federation (mainly in English).
5. Have attended, and have been an active participant in an IOF MTB Orienteering Event Advisers Clinic.
6. Be familiar with the IOF Rules and other relevant publications.
7. Be recognised as an expert in MTB orienteering and endorsed as suitable by your Federation.

Active foot orienteering organizers interested in learning the specifics of MTB orienteering events are also welcome to participate. No endorsement by federation required.

Course Content:

- Understanding of the task of an IOF Event Adviser
- Deeper understanding of the nature of orienteering and each format of MTB orienteering (long, middle, sprint, relay)
- Understanding of the IOF rules and requirements for international competition

The course will include a short field exercise in MTB orienteering mapping and course controlling.

Lunch on Saturday and Sunday is included in the clinic entry fee.

Travel: Birkerød can be reached by train in about 1 hour from Copenhagen airport.

- International Specification for MTB Orienteering Maps
- IOF MTB Orienteering Organisers' Guidelines
