#### 6.2 Review of WOC 2017 applications

- Unfortunately the IOF Office did not receive any applications for WOC 2017. FOC noted that the Council had already decided to open up a new round for applications with the new deadline being 30 June 2017.

### 6.3 Council's decision regarding the dates for the WOC 2015

- FOC decided to support GBR's proposed WOC dates (1.8.-8.8.), but also to ask WMOC organisers to re-schedule their program to finish on Friday with Long Final to avoid the clash with dates between WMOC and WOC, and enable participation and following of both major events.

# 7 World Cup MS

World Cup 2013: The season started early January in New Zealand. NORT bulletin is not in line with the WCup Special Rules. FOC asks SEAs to investigate the situations. SEAs should come back with a formal Special Rule change request (events 4-6).

World Cup 2014: For competitions in Turkey, preparations are on track. A Sprint Relay will also be organised in conjunction with the WCup race. Status report for the World Cup races in Spain and Portugal should be acquired by the next FOC meeting.

World Cup 2015: Races to be held in Australia (Tasmania - beginning of the year), NORT, WOC (GBR), SUI. SUI organisers are asking to have a Long Distance race instead of the traditional Middle Distance. FOC welcomes the

proposal.

### Review of World Cup 2016 applications

Applications received from SUI (PostFinance – WC-final – October) and POL (2 races in June/Sept).

It's a problem that the World Cup is changing from year to year. WM prepares a discussion paper on the future of the World Cup, including the possible inclusion of the Sprint Relay.

Review of WMOC 2016 applications: FOC discussed the four bids from DEN, EST, FRA and JPN and recommends that a shortlist of Denmark and Estonia is approved by Council. These were all good bids, two of them are outstanding. FOC encourages the bidders not shortlisted to apply again in the future. DM will assess each shortlisted candidate and arrangements have been made to visit both in mid-June.

- WMOC Guidelines: These have been updated for 2013.

### 16 IOF Course planning document and sprint recommendations

IOF Course planning document should be a living document, updated continuously. DM's Sprint recommendations should be added. It should be circulated in FOC and then sent to the IOF Office for publishing as a guideline.

17 WRE DM

Update. It should be noted, that no night events should be considered as WREs. Problems with map scales and printing is still a concern, EAs should be reminded, that they are ultimately responsible for Rules and standard concerning maps. WRE Guidelines should be updated next year (2014).

Italy successfully applied for an extra WRE via EWG for 2013. GBR is encouraged to do the same for 2015.

FOC would like to remove team size limitations from WOC 2014 onwards as accommodation is no longer the responsibility of the organiser. Also, in overall, limitation was not seen practical. 2014 was seen as a good year to introduce the change as WOC programme is changing. FOC decided to seek Council's approval to change the rule 6.5. to allow the team size to be a maximum of 28 competitors (up to 14 women and 14 men). Rules Commission will be asked to prepare the wording should the Council approves the proposal. This new rule should be in effect from 1.1.2014.
